Minutes of Meeting of Monday April 27, 2015

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by David Boynton II, Vice Chair, at 7:30 pm.

Announcement of Proper Notice

Notice of this meeting was provided by posting notice at the Township Municipal Building in Johnsonburg, and advertising in the New Jersey Herald and Express Times, in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act. As advertised, action may be taken at this meeting.

Approval of Minutes:

● Christopher Kuhn made a motion to approve the Environmental meeting minutes of March 23, 2015 minutes, seconded by Tammy Beckenthal – all in favor, aye. Robert Stock abstained.

Old Business

●Frelinghuysen Forest Preserve Update- Ms. Buttgerreit reported that there were 50 hikers in attendance on April 11, 2015. The property now has new signage. She invited volunteers to participate in the next FFP North clean up on May 2, 2015, commencing at 9am. Ms. Beckenthal stated that she received questions from Township residents as to why the Township is not selling the cottages located on the FFP North property (Kids Camp). Mayor Kuhn stated the cottages are covered with lead paint and contain asbestos.

Website:

- Ms. Beckenthal asked why the FFP link is not on the Township website. Mayor Kuhn stated that the link is on the homepage of the website, located in the lower left corner. He suggested refreshing her screen as the browser is old.

●Shredding and E Waste Day: Ms. Donna Zilberfarb is working on the date. Most likely it will be sometime in June.

●Sustainable New Jersey Update: The Hope Township Environmental Commission and Green Team are hosting a joint meeting for neighboring Township Committee and Environmental Commission Members. The meeting will be held on May 19, 2015 at the Hope Township Municipal Building at 7:30pm. Mayor Kuhn encouraged Commission member's participation.

●Historical Committee Update- Mayor Kuhn reported that the second reading regarding the ordinance pertaining to the formation of a new committee whose purpose is to work on obtaining grants for the preservation of historical properties, will take place on April 15, 2015 during the Township meeting. The aforementioned committee will consist of: the mayor, one Township Committee member, and seven township residents.

New Business

- Limestone Ordinance: Mr. Decarolis indicated that there are some questionable operations occurring at a residential property located at the corner of South and Green Hill streets. Limestone removal has significantly impacted the road quality, resulting in a lot of road damage. Unfortunately no one is aware of how many dumpsters have been filled and removed to date. Mr. Simonetti inquired as to whether this is a tax issue since the person removing the limestone is selling it. Mr. Simonetti will ask our tax assessor if it is indeed a tax issue. .

Public Comment

- Ms. Wendy Buttergrit indicated that she had recently spoken to a Warren County Mosquito Commission staff member regarding their usage of mosquito control insecticides and its effect on local amphibians. Ms. Buttergrit would like to look into the possibility of obtaining grants to finance bat houses and dragon fly population growth to control the mosquito population in an environmentally safe manner.


Correspondence
