A Message from your Mayor by Tom Charles

As always lots to report about our little town, so many things are going on and so many things are so important to us all. I would like to start by thanking all the residents and staff people who make this job such a pleasure. With out the many volunteers who do so much for the Town so little would get done.

The South Street project is moving along. If you have seen the white x's painted in the road they are for aerial maps so we can better design our flood mitigation project. People along South Street have terrible flooding after heavy rain. This past April saw some of the worst flooding since '96. The Committee was able to get a loan from DEP to help relieve this problem.

I asked all the members of all the boards to meet for a special meeting on April 14th. We had a tremendous turnout. The purpose of the meeting was to get board members to meet each other and learn about what the boards do. We had a demonstration about the new web site that John Jurena put together for us. As a result of John's work all the committees and boards will have their own page complete with minutes of meetings, e-mail address and all the community events. The most important objective of the meeting was for me to hear the concerns of the board members.

Overwhelmingly preservation of open space was their hands down top priority. Based on that information and because of what's not happening in Trenton with the preservation trust fund, I will ask the voters to approve additional 2cents tax to fund open space and farm land preservation funding.

You have all heard of the Highlands by now and there have been rumors about the Committee opting into the master plan. We just do not have enough information to make a decision yet. When we do, it will have plenty of public comment and well thought out reasons behind our decision.

As in many years gone by there will be no increase in the Municipal tax rate, this can be done because our paid workers are doing more. We also depend on volunteers like John Jurena who give his time and considerable talents to develop one of the most complete municipal web-sites in the State. A Message from your Clerk By Brenda Kleber, R.M.C.

The Following is a summary of Ordinances that took effect in 2006 that may be of interest to you:

#2006-02 - Regulates new driveway entrances fronting on Township roads.

#2006-06 - The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish minimum stormwater management requirements and controls for "major developments."

#2006-07 - Amends the Land Use Ordinances providing municipal stormwater control.

#2006-09 - Dissolves the Zoning Board of Adjustment (note: see Ordinance #2006-23).

#2006-10 - Establishes a fee to whom makes an application or changes the building footprint or the construction of a new home for updating and the maintenance of, the Geographic Information System.

#2006-12 - Creates an Open Space Committee, which advises the Township Committee on the properties for possible acquisition.

#2006-18 - Increases the license fees for dogs to \$10.00 for a spayed/neutered dog, and \$13.00 for a non-spayed/non-neutered dog.

#2006-18 - Amends the Building Department fee schedule increasing the plumbing fees.

#2006-23 - Reconstitutes the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

#2006-24 - Prohibits parking on Main Street, Lackawanna Drive and Ramsey Court when there is more than two inches of snow.

Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and takes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up on our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful, and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases, must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.

As a resident, business, or other members of the New Jersey Community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

LIMIT YOUR USE OF FERTILIZER OR PESTICIDES

- ◆ Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer;
- ◆ Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is expected;
- ◆ Look into alternatives for pesticides;
- ◆ Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer;
- ◆ If you use fertilizer and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it;
- ◆ Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints;
- ◆ Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local water bodies and the water is not treated.
- ◆ If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance;
- ◆ Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible;
- ◆ Recycle used motor oil;
- ◆ Contact the your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.

KEEP POLLUTION OUT OF STORM DRAINS

- ◆ Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- ◆ Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET

- ◆ Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules;
- ◆ An example is requiring pet owners, or their keepers, to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- ◆ Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It is the law!

And remember to:

- ◆ Use newspaper, bags or pooper scoopers to pick up wastes;
- ◆ Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet;
- ◆ Never discard pet waste in a storm drain!

DON'T LITTER

- ◆ Place litter in trash receptacles
- ◆ Recycle! Recycle! Recycle!
- ◆ Participate in community cleanups.

DISPOSE OF YARD WASTE PROPERLY

- ◆ Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- ◆ If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- ◆ Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.

“Rabies” are on the Move!

If you are bitten by an unfamiliar or wild animal, consider it potentially rabid. Especially if the bite was not provoked. If you are bitten, immediately do the following:

1. Wash the wound with soap and water;
2. Report the incident to a doctor, emergency room, or the police;
3. If possible, isolate the animal. Contact the Animal Control Office at (888)926-7554.



Black Bears live in this area of New Jersey. Be sure to do the following:

- ◆ Store garbage in air-tight containers, in secure area.
- ◆ Keep garbage bins near the inside wall of a garage, basement or in a secure shed.
- ◆ Wash the containers with disinfectant solution at least once a week to eliminate odors
- ◆ Put garbage out the day of disposal, not the night before.
- ◆ Do not feed the bears!

North Warren Regional School District announces proposed additions.

State reviewing project for construction at the school.

Blairstown, NJ May 3, 2007 - The North Warren Regional School District Board of Education has announced the approval of a two-part bond referendum to go before the voters in Blairstown, Hardwick, Knowlton, and Frelinghuysen in September, 2007. The bond questions are for additions and renovations to the current school facility located in Blairstown.

Due to increasing enrollment and class sizes that are reaching 30 students per classroom, the first question will address an addition of 13 new general academic classrooms, a new technology lab, a wrestling room, new bathroom facilities, a storage room, and a mechanical room. The proposed renovations also included in question 1 are the permanent walls to replace partitions in two classrooms, the renovation of the boys and girls locker rooms and converting the auxiliary gym and industrial arts room to team locker rooms, replacing the boiler, asbestos abatement as needed and parking lot and site upgrades. The second question will propose the addition of two art rooms, a music room and a weight room.

A group of key communicators worked with the facilities committee to review several options for the increasing enrollment. Tours of facilities committee to review several options for relieving the increasing enrollment. Tours of the facility were conducted late last year, and residents attended public forums in January and March of this year to share their thoughts on the preliminary proposals.

The proposed project was sent to the state department of education in April for review. The department will return its recommendations, along with eligible costs for debt service aid, in July for inclusion in the September referendum.

Additional information about the proposed project will be forthcoming as it becomes available. Voters can expect to receive newsletters detailing the scope of the project, funding, tax impact, and facility tours and open houses over the summer. Residents are also invited to board meetings on the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 7:30 p.m. in the media center.

North Warren Regional is a public secondary school district, service students in grades 7-12 in the Townships of Blairstown, Frelinghuysen, Hardwick and Knowlton.


