RULES & REGULATIONS

Proof of residency must be presented at disposal site before dumping, such as auto registration, tax bill, telephone bill, etc. Residents will be able to dump only 2-small pick-up truck loads, or 1 large pick-up load.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS ARE:

COMPUTERS & ELECTRONIC PARTS (i.e. monitors, printers, VCR's, FAX machines, modems, televisions) HAZARDOUS MATERIAL (i.e. paint, batteries, fluorescent lights, transmission fluid, antifreeze, solvents, mercury, gasoline, chemicals, pesticides, cleaners, sealer, motor oil, radioactive materials, and infectious waste).

Refrigerators, freezers, and/or air conditioners **ONLY** if tagged that Freon is removed. NO tires. NO propane tanks. Lawnmowers

Committee News**

A Community Forestry Management Plan is being developed in conjunction with the Environmental Commission. State approval of the plan will entitle the Township to apply for state funding for forestry related projects on Township properties.

The Township received grant funding from Warren County and NJ Green Acres. This funding can be used over the coming 2 years for the acquisition of property for public recreation (hiking, fishing, bird watching, picnicking).

This year's Chipper Parties are being conducted at Frelinghuysen Elementary School. The goal is to remove invasive Alanthius trees from the playground area behind the school. This project will allow native seedling and mature trees to grow and thrive. Environmental resource, including books on native and invasive plants, are available at Town Hall. Residents may borrow them for up to 2 weeks.

MANAGEMENT



Your Emergency Management Department has been busy holding training classes for a CERT (Community Emergency Response) Team. The CERT Team consists of residents from Frelinghuysen, Blairstown, and Hardwick, who were trained in basic disaster response skills, such as fire suppression, search and rescue, and medical operations. These classes help the residents take a more active role in emergency preparedness.

A second class is scheduled to begin Thursday, April 23, 2009 thru June 11, 2009. The class will run for 8 consecutive Thursday evenings, 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m., at the Frelinghuysen Township Elementary School. All interested parties must be at least 18 years of age.
