**RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A GREEN TEAM
ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen strive to save tax dollars, assure clean air and water, and improve working and living environments to build a community that is sustainable economically, environmentally and socially, and which will thrive well into the new century; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen wish to build a model of government which benefits our residents now and far into the future with green community initiatives which are easy to replicate and affordable to implement; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to focus attention on "green" issues, the Mayor and Township Committee wish to establish a Green Team Advisory Committee ("GTA"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee are committed to the process of addressing sustainability and "green" issues within the Township of Frelinghuysen, which include audits of municipality facilities and operations among other actions; and

WHEREAS, the Township will explore ways to reduce its environmental impact through consideration of operational changes in fleet purchasing and maintenance, reduction in energy consumption and the use of alternative energy sources, as well as broader community issues such as water quality improvements.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen as follows:

1. There is hereby established a Green Team Advisory Committee ("GTA"), consisting of three (3) members who shall be residents or employees of Frelinghuysen Township.

2. The GTA shall be a subcommittee of the Environmental Commission.

3. Membership of the GTA shall be as follows: (a) one member of the Environmental Commission; (b) one member of the Open Space Committee, and (c) one member selected from the public at large. Appointments to the GTA shall be made by the Environmental Commission, with the advice and consent of the Mayor and Township Committee.


4. The GTA shall advise the Environmental Commission and Mayor and Township Committee on ways to improve municipal operations with sustainability and "green" initiatives which are economically and environmentally sound through research and evaluation.

5. The GTA shall: (a) collaborate with Township employees, service providers and other governmental agencies to share resource information and ideas consistent with the Mission of the GTA; (b) encourage participation of all employees to solicit ideas on green initiatives; (c) research and analyze green initiatives which make practical environmental and financial sense, and (d) develop strategies for sustainable green initiatives in municipal operations.

4. This Resolution shall take affect according to law.

This letter is to provide legal notification pursuant to NJAC 7:7A-17 & NJAC 7:13-19 that the Warren County Mosquito Extermination Commission is applying to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), Land Use Regulation Program for a countywide Freshwater Wetlands Statewide General Permit 1 & General Permit 15 and a countywide Flood Hazard Area General Permit 1 & General Permit 2.

The countywide permit will authorize the WCMEC to conduct regulated activities in wetlands and transitional areas on properties throughout Warren County for the purpose of mosquito control. Activities and projects to be conducted will include continued maintenance, repair or restoration of existing drainage ditches, minor streams, stormwater facilities, and/or wetland areas of human origin as needed for mosquito control throughout Warren County.

If you would like to inspect a copy of the application, it is on file at the Municipal Clerk's Office in each township throughout the county, or you can call the NJDEP at (609) 777-0454 to make an appointment to see the application at NJDEP offices in Trenton during normal business hours.

The rules governing freshwater wetland and flood hazard area permits and approvals can be viewed or downloaded the NJDEP Land Use Regulation website at www.state.nj.us/dep/landuse, or you can find a copy of these rules in the county law library in your county courthouse.

The NJDEP welcomes any comments you may have on this application. Compliance Statement

Narrative:

The Warren County Mosquito Extermination Commission (WCMEC) is applying to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Land Use Regulation Program for the following 5 year countywide permits: Freshwater Wetlands General Permit 1 & General Permit 15 and Flood Hazard Area General Permit 1 & General Permit 2 for various water management projects within the County of Warren.

The WCMEC's water management projects focus mainly on three factors: preventative maintenance, the elimination of larval mosquito habitat, and reducing the use of chemicals for mosquito control. It is the WCMEC's obligation to the taxpayers of Warren County to provide a service that will enhance their quality of life by eliminating or reducing the undesirable effects caused by mosquitoes, which include the potential for disease transmission and annoyance to humans. This service is mandated under the New Jersey Statutes, Title 26 Health and Vital Statistics, Chapter 9, Mosquito Extermination.

Through water management techniques, mosquito populations are controlled by altering the aquatic habitat of mosquito larvae and pupae. The three basic strategies of water management are:






1. Removing excess surface water without the loss of hydric soil conditions.
2. Increasing the amount/depth of standing water to create suitable fish habitat and/or provide access for predaceous fish that will eat mosquito larvae.
3. Increasing the movement of water in the larval habitat (improving flow) and thus creating an inhospitable environment for mosquito larvae and pupae.

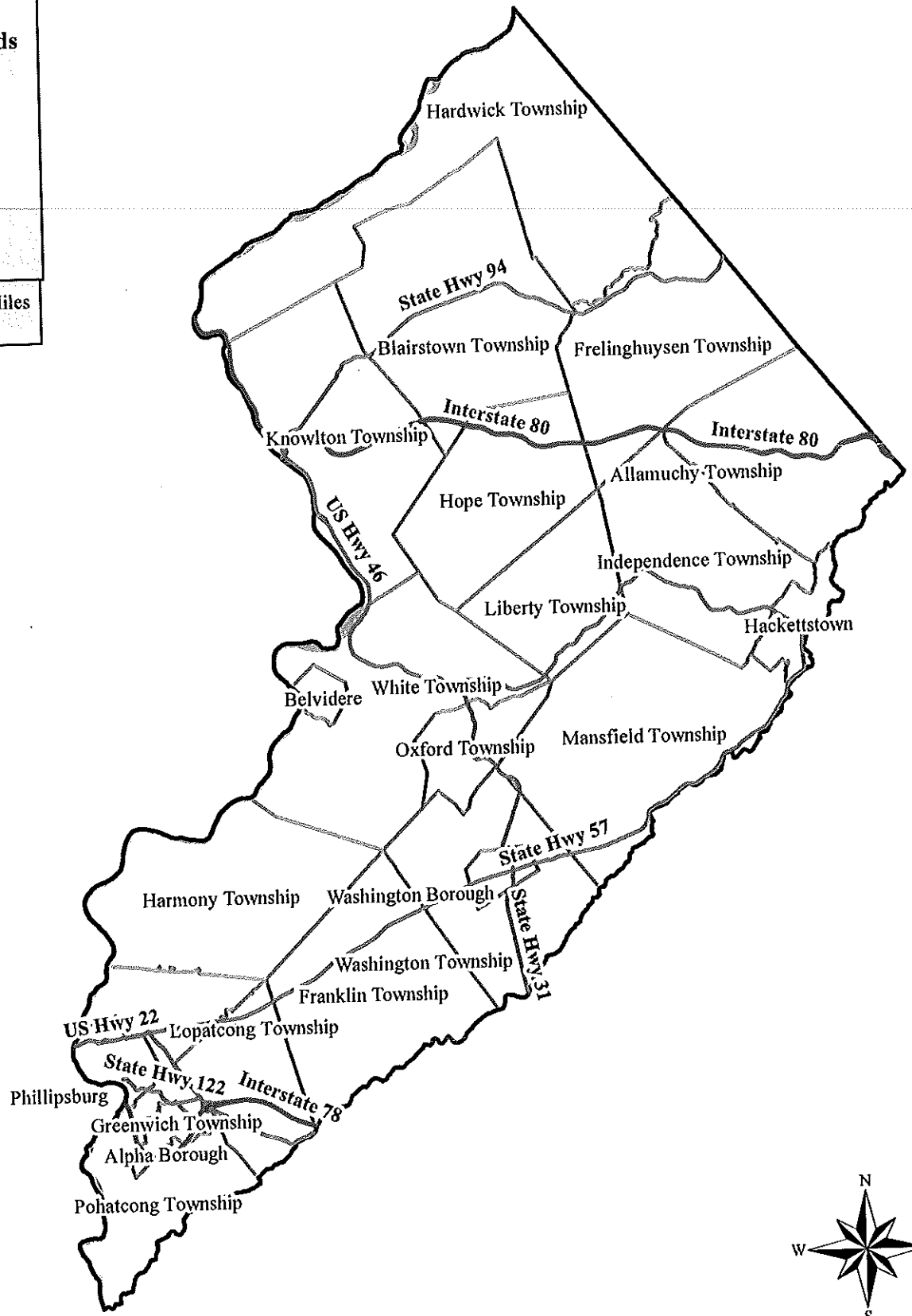
Countywide permits will be utilized to do the following types of work for mosquito control: continued maintenance, repair or restoration of existing drainage ditches, minor streams, stormwater facilities, and/or wetland areas of human origin as needed for mosquito control throughout Warren County.

I am sending you this letter to inform you that I am submitting an application for a permit or approval to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) under the Freshwater Wetlands Protection Act rules, N.J.A.C. 7:7A. The permit or approval will either establish the boundary of freshwater wetlands on the above property, or will authorize me to conduct regulated activities on the property.

If you would like to inspect a copy of my application, it is on file at the Municipal Clerk's Office in the town in which the property is located, or you can call the NJDEP at (609) 777-0454 to make an appointment to see my application at NJDEP offices in Trenton during normal business hours.

The rules governing freshwater wetlands permits and approvals are found in the NJDEP's Freshwater Wetlands Protection Act rules at N.J.A.C. 7:7A. You can view or download these rules on the NJDEP Land Use Regulation Program website at www.state.nj.us/dep/landuse, or you can find a copy of these rules in the county law library in your county courthouse.

As part of the NJDEP's review of my application, NJDEP personnel may visit my property, and the portion of any neighboring property that lies within 150 feet of my property line, to perform a site inspection. This site inspection will involve only a visual inspection and possibly minor soil borings using a 4" diameter hand auger. The inspection will not result in any damage to vegetation or to property improvements.



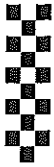

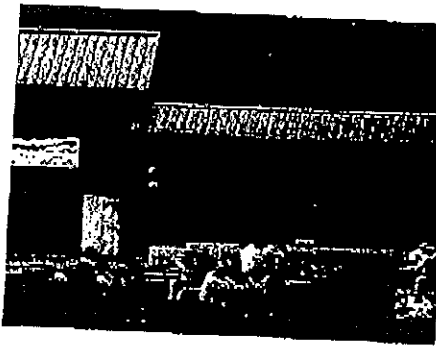
